## Parenting Smart

## Lower School

The children in Lower School have been busy designing eggs as we have been asked to take part in the Sovereign Centre hunt again this year. Keep your eyes peeled for the winning design hidden in the shops in April.


We have also been working hard on being 'confident communicators' in our communication café and helicopter story sessions. As part of this, we have been increasing our bank of dressing up items. If you have any costumes at home that no longer fit or you no longer use, we would love to make use of them at school and so would be very grateful for any donations.

## Middle School

We have a number of students in middle school whose uniform has slipped and this is having an effect on behaviour in class and at breaktime. Your child's teacher will be discussing this with them during their tutor sessions next week and will be sharing good examples of uniform.

Whilst we recognise that some students have difficulties wearing uniform we are starting to notice that lots of students are making adaptations to the uniform that are not for sensory needs. Whilst we recognise a shirt, tie and blazer is too much for some students I would request that they are substituted with polo shirt or white t-shirt, black or blue jogging bottoms and a black or blue jumper (the school PE one is fine) with either the school logo or no logo. For PE it is the house colour t-shirt or polo shirt, blue PE jumper and black or blue PE bottoms.

We will also be giving Dojo points for those in the correct uniform every day to recognise how many of our students do wear their uniform with pride. We will also award those who are in correct uniform which has been adapted for sensory needs. if you would like support to encourage your child to wear a more suitable uniform or have any questions please get in touch with your child's tutor.

You may have also heard that we are trialling opening up forest school for middle school students at lunch and break. We have grouped the students into areas we think they will enjoy, we have mixed classes to allow for social interaction and have thought carefully about where students would like to be. We have invited them to discuss this with us if they would like to be somewhere else. At lunch and break students will use their designated area with their friends. We will start this on Monday and will review it periodically.

## Upper School

We've had a busy time in Upper School this week! On Wednesday, Nottingham Class enjoyed a visit to the Life Skills Centre in Bristol where they learnt about basic first aid, safety in the home and safety in the community. W6 have had a brilliant time on their residential at Kilve Court where they took part in archery, circus skills, a Quantock walk, grass sledging and a disco.
