Upper School:

Our Year 10 GCSE learners had a fantastic time on a field trip to Ashfield reservoir, near Cannington. They were able to learn about the process of water treatment of river water in order to make it into drinking water. The students found the information very interesting. We were then able to carry out some field work in the streams, looking for organisms and measuring the speed of the water flow. One learner said, the best part of the trip was seeing the use of some elements from the periodic table in real life.
