Learning with your child at home Use your strongest language to boost your child's learning!

Get your child to explain the task in your home language.

Talk about the topic together in your home language.

Ask questions about the work in your home language e.g. How does that work? What do we have to do? How do you know that?

Explain the concepts in your home language.

Make notes or draft a piece of work together in your home language.

Do a home language version of the work.

Use a bilingual dictionary / online translator.

Contact your child's teacher if you don't understand the work.

Join / set up a WhatsApp, Facebook or other social media group with other parents, especially a group with parents who speak the same home language.

Watch BBC iPlayer programmes with English subtitles on.

Read together in your home language.
