Lower School:

It has been a very successful week for most of our learners and many are now in full swing with their new class teams and timetables. The sun has continued to shine and we have once again been able to make great use of our lovely new outdoor spaces.

We had our school photographs taken on Wednesday and all managed the process very well.

As with Middle School, we will be looking to appoint new roles of responsibility within Lower School. These positions will include 2 head learners, school council representatives and house captains. The teachers will be helping to support the learners interested in these positions with their 'application'.

Middle School:

Middle school had their first Middle School Assembly in the hall on Monday and I could not have been more pleased with them. We still had a few technology difficulties but despite this they came in so quietly and waited patiently. Their learning behaviour during assembly was exceptional. In our assembly we talked about new beginnings and starting anew. Some learners and staff shared things they want to do better or differently this year and we discussed how a new school year can be a good time to make a positive change.

In assembly I also mentioned our head learners. Middle School are looking for two head learners who will have some responsibility within Middle School. Duties last year included supporting new learners, helping on interviews for staff, delivering Christmas cards and this year we plan to also ask head learners to help with inter-house competitions (more on that later) I have said they will need to write (or draw or record a video) to myself (Mrs Cantello) and Mr Orchard to say why they think they would be good at this. I have not set a deadline for this yet.

Upper School:

Learners in Upper School have enjoyed their first full week, all having partaken in their 'option' lessons. It has been wonderful to hear the enthusiasm from Year 10 learners who are undertaking a 'new' subject, for example Hair and Beauty, Duke of Edinburgh or Photography, as well as the Year 11 learners returning with confidence and commitment to their qualifications.

Upper School had their first phase assembly this week, in which we spoke about the journey we are on in Upper School and likened it to a rollercoaster ride. We acknowledged that there may be hurdles and challenges along the way and each person was at a different point, but we were all on the journey together.

Upper School is looking to appoint 2 new Head Students for this academic year. Duties will include being a role model, assisting with school tours, staff interviews and parental events. Learners are invited to apply by expressing their interest in writing to Ms Wells by the end of September. Successful candidates will be invited to an interview. Candidates will be notified of the interview and will be given the questions in which they will be asked in advance, thus allowing them time to prepare.


