Another incredibly busy and productive week at Westhaven, it was so lovely to see many of you in person on Tuesday for 'meet the teams' evening. I know lots more joined online and had the opportunity to discuss your child with the teachers. I hope you found the evening beneficial as this is the first time we have tried doing this event at this early stage of the year. The turnout was higher than previous parent/carer evenings so that is really positive.

You may be aware that the Department for Education (DfE) are focussing on levels of attendance in schools nationally. The government is concerned about learners missing education, especially post pandemic since attendance levels have fallen. The expectation is that children attend for at least 95% of the time. Schools will continue to report attendance rates, as we always have had to, but now there will be even greater scrutiny. If your child's attendance falls below 90%, we will write to you to alert you of this. If it drops below 80% you will be required to attend a meeting with me to discuss how we can put in place strategies to improve attendance.

Could I also remind you that lessons begin promptly at 8:45, therefore if you bring your child to school please try to arrive by 8:40 which will enable them sufficient time to register.

Enjoy reading and seeing all that has been going on this week at school and have a wonderful weekend.



Maths Matters:




