Oh yes it is! The pantomime on Friday morning brought smiles and cheer to Upper School learners - a lovely treat to the end of the week and start of December.





Learners are advised to practise spellings at home. Some learners will be provided with extra spelling support sheets to aid them in the revision of these.


Learners will then get the option of completing their spelling bee in their classrooms or joining classes for a whole phase assembly competition.
