Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the final weekly newsletter of 2023, however you will be receiving an end of term one from your child's class next week.

As the term and calendar year draws to a close, I am in a reflective mood, proud of all the hard work and successes achieved by both the staff team and the learners. There are of course far too many to list now but I do know that since I took the substantive Headteacher role, the school environment has changed significantly and the vision and values are now embedded.

As you know, I have communicated a few times about attendance, as it is such a hot topic with the DfE at the moment. I am pleased to report that our overall school attendance figure is currently 90.4% for two terms, this is above the national figure for special schools which is 87.3%. You will continue to receive a termly email from now on with your child's attendance information.

If your child's attendance is 80-90%, which there may be good reasons for such as medical appointments, we may need to contact you to see if we can support you further. If attendance is below 80% then we will have to contact you and invite you into school for a meeting to discuss strategies to help improve your child's attendance.

There is much to look forward to for the remainder of the academic year, but for now I wish you all a lovely weekend and then a wonderful Christmas and New Year.




Sports Desk:
