#### **About Us:**

Westhaven is a dedicated Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) school, committed to providing a nurturing and inclusive learning environment for children with a range of learning difficulties, primarily moderate learning difficulties with additional associated needs. We are situated in the beautiful village of Uphill, nestled near the beach and golf course near Weston-super-Mare.

Our learners have varying aptitudes and abilities; we are extremely proud of all their achievements and progress. They have a range of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) including: Autism (ASC); Cognition and Learning needs; Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Speech, Language and Communication Needs (SLCN). We seek to ensure that, by the time they leave us, our learners emerge as self-confident individuals; equipped with the skills and competencies to successfully take the next steps in their lives.

We are a friendly, happy and caring school, providing a positive, inclusive and enriching educational experience for our young people. We view each of our learners as unique and shape our provision to meet their individual needs and accelerate their progress in a variety of areas e.g. personal, social, academic and well-being. Our commitment to supporting the 'whole' child and their development is underpinned by our strong pastoral systems and our committed and trained staff. At Westhaven, we promote inclusion and equality and celebrate diversity.

The learning strands within the school are split to enable all learners to succeed and each has a slightly different curriculum. These are:

- Encounter and Explore: a strand for learners who have more severe needs and are working towards EHCP outcomes
- **Connect and Grow**: a strand for learners who can access the national curriculum at their academic level but need sensory, S&L and regulation support
- **Aspire and Excel**: a strand for learners who are more able to advocate for their own needs and self-regulate but continue to need the support of their EHCP
- **Engage and Respond**: a small strand within the school for learners whose SEMH needs have become more significant than their cognition and learning needs
- **Develop and Empower**: Our 6th Form provision for learners who are not quite ready for larger post 16 settings

# The Role:

This post has arisen due to staff progression. The role is within KS3 (although most suitable to a primary trained teacher) and will be within either the **Connect and Grow** strand or the **Aspire and Excel** strand. We are seeking a compassionate and skilled SEND Teacher to join our dedicated team. The successful candidate will:

 Teach lessons across the curriculum which meet the needs of learners with moderate to severe learning difficulties and associated needs

- Create and adapt plans and teaching strategies to support learners based on the outcomes and provision in their EHCPs
- Foster an engaging and supportive classroom environment where all learners are valued, inspired and prepared
- Work collaboratively with the class team, parents and other stakeholders and professionals to develop individualised learning strategies
- Monitor progress and provide feedback to ensure continuous development
- Monitor progression against the EHCPs of learners and, where appropriate, the subject KPI
- Complete relevant EHCP review paperwork and run EHCP reviews; overseen by the SENCO
- Lead an area of the curriculum across the school
